Carbon Capture Field Trip!

On February 24, the UofR Women's Club will tour the International Test Centre (ITC) for Carbon Dioxide (CO2) capture at the University of Regina. According to their website, the ITC is a world-class laboratory "...including a field demonstration plant, a multi-purpose technology development plant, and various other pilot plant units for testing high efficiency gas treating systems." This particular research field at the University of Regina has garnered local, national, and international attention with financial and engineering and scientific support from across the globe. Dr. Malcolm Wilson, the Director of the Office of Energy and Environment at the University of Regina, will be offering the tour of the facility. Dr. Wilson was a member of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) who won the Nobel Peace Prize with former US vice-president Al Gore.
