On the Form, permission is requested from the member for the printing of personal information, in accordance with privacy policies. A member can also indicate preference for a mailed copy as opposed to electronic transfer of information. The executive committee retains and acts on preferences and requests recorded on the Membership Form. The Membership Form also records members who are willing to drive a member without transportation to events the driver is attending. University of Regina Women - 2013 Bursary and Award

Recipient of 2012 Annual Award, the Dr. Anne Lavack Bursary

In early December, we were notified that the recipient of our 2012 annual \$1000.00 award, given in Anne Lavack's name, is Cassandra L Whitelaw, who is pursuing a Bachelor of Business Administration degree with a major in Accounting. The bursary fund was paid out to her by the university on December 2, a welcome early Christmas present for Cassandra.

2013 Annual Award, the Linda Joan Paul Bursary

The annual bursary in 2013 will be presented to a woman studying Human Geography. In designating this area, Linda indicated that throughout her teaching career, her preferred focus was on Human Geography, with special interest in the areas of Gender and Geography, Aboriginal Geography, Geography and Literature and Geography and Culture.

Linda has been highly involved in gender issues at the academic level and has thus been a member and chair of URFA's Status of Women Committee, as well as serving for six years on the Canadian Association of University Teachers' Status of Women Committee. She has co-edited a book, Women in the Canadian Academic Tundra: Challenging the Chill, and has been on the editorial committee for Inside Corporate U: Women in the Academy Speak Out. She has published many articles on women, with special interest in female academics who are in other than tenure track positions. She is also an activist and conecrned with community and international issues.

Linda, a long-time member of University of Regina Women, has been active on the executive of U of R Women for a number of years. As well, she participates in a variety of our special interest groups – Book Clubs #1 and #2, International Gourmet Food Club, Bridge Club, Curling Club, Eclectic Events and the Walking Club.

Our treasurer, Kay Antrobus, reports that for the U of R Women's 2013 Bursary, which will be given in Linda's name, a total sum of \$1075.00 was donated by our members during the period September – December, 2012. We thank each of you for your generous contributions to the bursary. The university will be mailing tax receipts for these donations before the end of February.

University of Regina Women's 50th Anniversary Award, Audrey McKinnon Award

In celebration of the founding 50 years ago of the predecessor to University of Regina Women, we are offering a special award in the name of our first president, Audrey McKinnon. As reported in the fall newsletter, our \$1000.00 contribution is being matched by money from the province's *Innovation and Opportunities Program*. In addition, the fund recently received an additional \$1000.00 from Eleanor Coomber, daughter of Audrey McKinnon and her husband James Coomber, a sum that they are donating in Eleanor's mother's memory. With the Coomber-McKinnon donation, the award now is worth \$3000.00 and will be given to a woman who is studying in the Faculty of Engineering. Directing the award to a woman in engineering was done for two reasons, Eleanor's father (Audrey McKinnon's husband) was one of the first professors of Engineering in Regina and the matching grant from the *Innovation and Opportunities Program* was designated by the government for the field of Engineering.
