U of R Women – Annual Bursary and 50th Anniversary Award

Annual Bursary

Our treasurer, Kay Antrobus, reports that a total sum of \$1075.00 was donated by our members during the period September – December, 2012, to be used for our 2013 bursary. We thank each of you for your generous contributions. Those of you who donated should have received a tax receipt from the U of R by this time.

The bursary, given by our group in honour of Linda Paul, will go to a woman studying Human Geology. Deadline for applications for this bursary is April 10, 2013 with the recipient being announced at the beginning of December 2013.

Motion Regarding Annual Bursary

In early December, U of R Women received a letter from the External Relations Department of the University of Regina which indicated that, over the years, we have developed a surplus in our account with them. The letter says, "Currently there is \$2595 available to allocate in addition to the annual award and the new 50th anniversary award". At a recent executive meeting, a motion was made and seconded regarding the disbursement of this sum of money. The motion will be voted on at the Annual General Meeting of U of R Women on Wednesday, April 24.

Motion: That the value of the annual bursary be increased from its present \$1000.00 per year to \$1200.00 per year. The \$200.00 increase should be taken from the almost \$2600.00 available to us from the account through External Relations Department of the U of R. (S. McKague/K Antrobus)

Rationale for motion: Student tuition is increasing and since this money is available to us, it should be used to assist our bursary recipients, rather than sitting in an account in External Relations. With the interest the capital will generate, the funds in this 'just discovered' account (one which has been invisible to our organization, but has gradually been growing over the years) is enough to fund 13 years (2014 – 2026) of an increase in the bursary amount.

University of Regina Women's 50th Anniversary Award, Audrey McKinnon Award

In celebration of the founding 50 years ago of the predecessor to University of Regina Women, we are offering a special award in the name of our first president, Audrey McKinnon. As reported in the fall newsletter, our \$1000.00 contribution is being matched by money from the province's Innovation and Opportunities Program. In addition, the fund received an additional \$1000.00 from Eleanor Coomber, daughter of Audrey McKinnon and her husband James Coomber, a sum that they are donating in Eleanor's mother's memory. With the Coomber-McKinnon donation, the award now is worth \$3000.00 and will be given to a woman who is studying in the Faculty of Engineering. Directing the award to a woman in engineering was done for two reasons, Eleanor's father (Audrey McKinnon's husband) was one of the first professors of Engineering in Regina and the matching grant from the Innovation and Opportunities Program was designated by the government for the field of Engineering.
