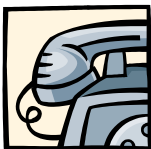

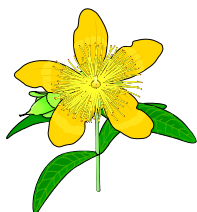
Bursary News

Notice of Bursary Award

The U of R Women- 2005 Patricia Bryce Bursaries

Value: \$1000 for each of two awards

Closing Date: May 15, 2005

Application Forms: Available from Awards Office, Room 229, Riddell Centre, University of Regina.

Conditions of the Award: This bursary is to be awarded to a female student in Education who is focusing her studies in Middle years or Secondary Education, and who has completed at least 30 credit hours of her program. The candidate can be enrolled in full or part-time studies during the 2004-2005 academic year and must have a minimum 70% PGPA. In addition, she must demonstrate financial need.

Award Honours Patricia Bryce: Patricia Bryce served on the executive and as president of the University of Regina Women, participating in the organization until her move to Vernon, B.C. She was born in Flin Flon, Manitoba in 1934. After completing high school, she earned a degree in Home Economics at the University of Manitoba, where she met Bob Bryce. They married in 1956 and had three children. In 1975, she returned to university to complete a Diploma in Education from the University of Alberta. Pat taught Home Economics to junior high students in Sherwood Park, Alberta. She was passionate about teaching. With her eye for colour and patience, she inspired her students. Pat and Bob Bryce came to Regina when Bob was appointed Dean of Education in 1983. Pat taught adult sewing classes in outdoor clothing while residing here. With her strength of character, her sense of humour, and her caring personality, she made many life long friends.

Pat and Bob retired to Vernon in 1998 where Pat discovered the joy of quilting, creating works of art to be enjoyed for generations to come. She died on August 8th, 2002. Her daughter, Brenda (Spitzer) and sons, David and Richard, and their families are proud that two University of Regina Women bursary awards in her memory will be given in 2005 to students dedicated to education of youth, namely two students specializing in, or intending to work in, the field of middle years or secondary education.
