**Ruth Smillie** is a director, playwright, actor, and theatre educator. Born in Vanderhoof, British Columbia, in 1954, Ruth's family lived in Vancouver and Massachusetts, before settling in Saskatoon in 1961. Ruth spent a year at the University of Saskatchewan before moving to Toronto in 1974 to study acting at Ryerson University. Upon graduating from Ryerson in 1978, Ruth worked as an actor in Vancouver, Calgary, Edmonton and Saskatoon.

In 1979, Ruth Smillie was cast as ten-year old Hilary in *Hilary's Birthday* by Joe Weisenthal, a production of Green Thumb Theatre in Vancouver, and she

performed this role for almost two years including a two month tour to Europe.

In 1981, Ruth was invited to start Persephone Youtheatre in Saskatoon. She moved to Edmonton in 1985 as Artistic Director of Catalyst Theatre. While in Edmonton, Ruth taught an acting course at the University of Alberta and served on the Touring Advisory for the Canada Council for the Arts for three years. In 1993, Ruth was the Visiting Fellow at King Alfred's College in Winchester. In 1994, Ruth was the Canadian Tutor Delegate for an international festival of young playwrights in Townsville, Australia. Ruth Smillie's plays for young audiences have been produced by theatres across Canada.

In 1998, Ruth Smillie was appointed Artistic Director of Globe Theatre. During her time at the Globe, Ruth initiated a second stage program, The Shumiatcher Sandbox Series, which develops and presents new works by emerging artists, and has directed numerous plays.

Ruth Smillie was presented with the University of Saskatchewan Alumni Award in 2000 and the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal in 2002. Ruth is the mother of three children: Emmaline, Thomas, and Lucy.



### The U of R Women–Marilyn Lewis Bursary

Value: \$1000

Closing Date: April 30, 2007

**Conditions of the Award**: The bursary is to be awarded to a female student in the Faculty of Education who has chosen to specialize in Elementary Education. The candidate must have completed at least 30 credit hours of her program with a minimum PGPA of 70%. She must be enrolled in either full or part-time studies for the 2007-2008 academic year and must demonstrate financial need.

Award Honours Marilyn Lewis: The University of Regina Women 2007 Bursary is awarded in honour of Marilyn Lewis. Marilyn was a long-time member of the University of Regina Women and was actively involved in many of the Interest Groups, including both Book Clubs, the Eclectic Events group, and the International Cooking group, serving as Convener several times. She joined the U of R Women group after she moved to Regina with her two daughters and husband, Ed Lewis, who had accepted a position as Assistant Professor of Music.

At age 14, Marilyn Reisler was reviewed in the New York Times as a "prodigy" for her debut harp recital in Carnegie Hall. She received her Bachelor of Music Degree from the Juilliard School of Music and, after a distinguished career as a harpist, she studied and received both her Bachelor and Master of Education Degrees from the University of Regina. Following the family move to Regina, Marilyn played harp for the Regina Symphony for a few years and then focused on teaching. She taught for the Regina Public School system for almost 30 years. Sadly, Marilyn passed away, after a battle with cancer, in the Spring of 2005.


