A public defender with Legal Aid and Vice-President of CUPE Local 1949, Meara Conway was recently named one of Canada's *Top 25 Most Influential Lawyers* for her work representing activists of the Justice for our Stolen Children Camp and for her contribution to the struggle against recent attempts to privatize and cut Legal Aid.

Throughout her career, Meara has been active on many seminal constitutional issues of our day and has appeared at all levels of court, including the Supreme Court of Canada. She is committed to advocating for vulnerable communities and has worked in child welfare and social assistance reform, Indigenous rights, and for refugee and migrant justice.

University of Regina Bursary

The honouree for the 2019 bursary is Alison Hayford, who is Professor Emerita in the Department of Sociology and Social Studies. She retired from the University in 2011 after a 33 year career. Before coming to the University of Regina, she worked as a budget analyst for the Province of Saskatchewan, where she was the first woman to be promoted to senior analyst in the Budget Bureau. Alison is originally from the United States, with a BA from Barnard College and a doctorate from the University of Michigan. She moved to Canada and to Regina in 1973. Her husband Paul Gingrich is Professor Emeritus in the Department of Sociology and Social Studies. She has two daughters of whom she is very proud: Jane, a professor of Political Science at Oxford, and Meg, a researcher with the United Steelworkers Union/Syndicat des metallos, and three grandsons, two in the UK and one in Toronto, that she doesn't see often enough.

As per university policy, the bursary goes to an undergraduate student in sociology with a minimum of 53 credit hours (2 years completed).

To date \$1005.00 has been donated to the bursary. Our goal is \$1200.
