

CPHR GRADUATE INTERNSHIPS...

The CPHR Training Program has created a limited number of paid internships within community-based organizations, in which trainees learn to link research effectively with policy and practice. Stipends will be used to cover trainees' costs while working as an intern. All interested trainees must apply for internship funding after being accepted in the CPHR Training Program. Selection and adjudication criteria will be based on the CPHR Training Program's application procedures.

Value: \$6,000/internship

THE CURRICULUM

- 3 credit-unit course
- learning retreats
- day-long seminars
- bi-weekly seminars
- thesis plus the home Department's core program requirements

All trainees (excluding work-sabbatical candidates) will meet the graduate program requirements of their home department. The CPHR Training Program has an enriched curriculum. It's core course, "Interdisciplinary Perspectives in Population Health Research and Practice", provides the foundation knowledge for the program. The course, based at the University of Saskatchewan, is offered via satellite to trainees located at both the University of Regina and the University of Saskatchewan. Trainees will also attend learning

retreats (2-4 days/academic year) and day-long seminars (2-4/academic year) featuring national and international visiting scholars. The thesis must fit within one of SPHERU's current research programs. This is one of the criteria for trainee selection. Masters' level trainees will be strongly encouraged to publish their findings; PhD level trainees are required to do so.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE...

Your application will include:

1. official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions;
2. letter of admission to graduate studies or copy of application for admission to graduate studies (CPHR scholarships are contingent on acceptance within a graduate program at one of the two Universities);
3. a personal statement indicating your background and career objectives as they relate to the CPHR Training Program;
4. an outline of your proposed thesis topic and how your research fits within SPHERU's research programs;
5. an updated CV; and
6. a completed CPHR application form.
